- **Innovative Fundraising** - Through fundraising and capital campaigns, Jane has increased financial support, which has helped improve our facilities and establish state-of-the-art medical services for patients who deserve safe, high-quality care. Recently, Jane led a record-breaking campaign to open a new 64-bed hospital and Medical Office Building in Clay County.
